### BACKGROUND

For more than two decades, HM Inspectorate of Prisons for England and Wales (HMI Prisons) has conducted detailed, confidential surveys of prisoners and other detainees as an integral part of its inspections. This has generated a unique **database** of historic survey data from almost 100,000 respondents, with more than 10 million analysable responses.

## **OBJECTIVES**

This project seeks to develop a 20 year database of detainee surveys to:

**Identify** detainees' self-reported characteristics (e.g. age, ethnicity, gender) and experiences of imprisonment;

Understand how these self-reported experiences differ according to characteristics and circumstances, prison held in and policy changes;

**Prepare** aspects of the database for use by other academic researchers, teachers and policy makers.






### DATABASE
